# International Center of the Capital Region to Host Delegates **Representing Non Government Organizations from 20 Different Countries**

The Group's Goal is to Examine NGO and Public Service Organizations in the United States

(Troy, N.Y.) – The International Center of the Capital Region (ICCR) will be hosting 21 delegates affiliated with various non governmental organizations (NGO) from 20 different countries across the globe with a mission to examine innovative NGO, nonprofit, public service, and advocacy organization management strategies in the United States, between Monday, November 6th and Wednesday, November 8th.

Specifically while in the Capital Region, the group will explore a thematic focus surrounding network formations and diaspora philanthropy, board leadership, recruitment, and fundraising, innovation collaboration to address issues, raising up diverse leaders and systems change, and exploring public and private partnerships at the local level.

The countries being represented are Algeria, Armenia, Bahamas, Costa Rica, Egypt, Estonia, France, Marshall Islands, Mexico, Morocco, Mozambique, Nepal, Nigeria, Poland, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Slovak Republic, Uganda, Ukraine, and the United Kingdom.
